Clinical waste segregation



INFECTIOUS AND AUTOCLAVED LAB WASTE ONLY, Including dressings,

swabs, disposables used PPE, contaminated wipes, spillage sets, nappies, incontinence pads. <u>Waste which is not</u> <u>infectious should be disposed of</u> <u>in the non-clinical waste stream</u>

ALL BAGS MUST BE IDENTIFIABLE USING THE UNIQUE LOCATION ID. Recognisable Body Parts, Tissue and Organs inc placenta, Suction Liners, Cell Saver, Bypass, Dialysis sets and body fluid drains. All un-autoclaved CL2 Lab Waste and Pathology specimens.

ALL LIQUIDS TO BE GELLED WHERE POSSIBLE ALL BINS TO BE PROPERLY SEALED AND LABELLED AS PER INSTRUCTIONS IN THE YELLOW BOX BELOW

Sharps used syringes, and similar invasive devices. <u>Any</u> residual medicine however small must be disposed of in a blue topped box

MUST BE SEALED PROPERLY AND STORED SEPARATELY FROM ORANGE WASTE BAGS

Sharps used syringes, and similar invasive devices etc... used to administer cytotoxic medicines; chemotherapy sharps. Cytotoxic products include: all antineoplastic, hormonal, antiviral, and immunosuppressant drugs, routinely used in many areas NOT just Oncology.

MUST BE SEALED PROPERLY AND STORED SEPARATELY



Waste sharps with residual medication, however small, medicines and other pharmaceutical products.

MUST BE SEALED PROPERLY AND STORED SEPARATELY

For ALL LIQUID waste please use 'Griff -Grip' bins – NDC SKU: 235469 clinical waste bin yellow 60lt with lid. Yellow Bags and small containers of waste for incineration must be placed into a rigid yellow container

All yellow bins MUST be labelled with :

- 1. Contents i.e:
- Anatomical waste or
- Lab waste or
- Suction waste or
- Other waste for incineration
- 2. Name of the hospital and producing department
- 3. Date bin closed

These details should be written clearly on the side using an indelible marker. Bins without these details will not be collected from the department

Aerosols:



Aerosols are classed as 'Non Clinical Hazardous Waste' unless they contain a medicine/pharmaceutical product . They must be identified, stored and collected separately from other streams. Plaster Casts and Dental Moulds



These products contain **gypsum** and they need to be **disposed of separately** from other waste streams. Please contact your local Facilities Department for advice.

N.B. Gypsum containing waste products are not collected from Community Dental Practices.



Glass is classed as a non clinical hazardous waste and should not be disposed of in clinical waste, **UNLESS** it has contained any medicinal or other pharmaceutical products. In this case a yellow container with a **blue lid** should be used.
