

Quick Reference Guide: MDR, XDR & CPE

Organism:	Multi-drug resistant Gram-negative bacteria
Signs & symptoms:	Variable depending on the site of infection
Transmission (spread):	Contact, droplet, airborne – dependent on site of colonisation/infection.
	Discuss with IPCT.
Person to person spread possible?	Yes
Incubation period:	n/a
People most at risk:	All patients. NNU, ITU, Neurosurgery, Oncology and Haematology are at particular risk.
Treatment:	As per the reported antimicrobial susceptibilities or as appropriate for the clinical manifestation or drug intolerances.
Key management & control measures	For MDR,XDR, PDR and CPE:
(MUST DO'S):	Isolate all suspected or confirmed cases when possible or use the NHS Lothian Isolation Prioritisation Policy.
	Discuss with Infection Prevention and Control if isolation not possible.
	Transmission based precautions to be put in place as per route of transmission.
	Appropriate isolation poster to be used.
	Correct PPE selected.
	Dedicated patient care equipment.
	All linen to be treated as infected.
	 Enhanced/increased frequency of cleaning of equipment and environment with Chlorclean, particularly in toilet areas.
	Document all risk assessments and communications in patient notes.
	For CPE, the CPE daily checklist should be implemented
