

# Orchidopexy

After the Operation

### **Going home**

Boys who have had an orchidopexy operation are usually able to go home within 24 hours.

#### The wound

Your son will have a small wound in his groin and in his scrotum. Both will be closed with dissolving stitches. The stitches can take between 2-4 weeks to dissolve and fall away. Some bruising and swelling is not unusual over the next few days, however if this is excessive please contact your GP or if out of hours NHS 24.

If you see any signs of infection at the wound areas please contact your GP or if out of hours NHS 24.

Signs of wound infection can include an increase in pain, swelling or redness around the stitch line, discharge from the wound which is discoloured, a strong smell from the area or if your child has a temperature and is unsettled.

#### **Pain**

Some discomfort will be experienced after surgery. We advise using a combination of ibuprofen and paracetamol, following the dosage instructions on the bottle/boxes.

You will also be provided with three doses of oral morphine solution and we advise using this in the first 24 hours after your child's operation. Oral morphine solution is a stronger pain relief.

### **Bathing and clothing**

You should give your son daily baths in the morning, for a week after the operation. It is best not to add anything to the bath water.

Loose-fitting clothes may be most comfortable. It is important that no other creams, ointments or talc are applied directly to or near the wound.

## Play and school

To minimise swelling it is advised that your son avoids activity and rests for the first three days after surgery.

Your son should be fit to return to school or nursery approximately seven days following their operation.

Sporting activities can start again when completely healed, usually after 4-6 weeks.
