

# Rheumatology Telephone Consultation

Information for patients

Please read this information leaflet as it contains important information about your rheumatology telephone consultation.

# Before your telephone consultation:

Make a note of any:

- Medication(s) you are taking
- Concerns about medication(s) and/or your condition
- Questions you have for the clinician.

Many patients also find it beneficial to have a pen and paper ready to take notes during the telephone consultation.

# If any of the following apply to you, you will need to be seen at a face-to-face appointment:

- You are having a current flare of your disease
- You feel that your condition has worsened since your last appointment
- You are having medication side effect(s)
- You are hard of hearing and struggle over the phone
- You would like somebody to attend with you
- You would feel more comfortable with a face-to-face appointment.

To change your appointment to a face-to-face consultation, please contact your consultant's secretary (you can find their telephone number on your clinic letter or by dialling the switch board- telephone number below).

Please note, changing your appointment to face-to-face will not change the date/time of your scheduled appointment

If anything is unclear or if you are unsure of anything please do not hesitate to ask the Clinician to clarify.
